ADDENDUM A: BACKGROUND INFORMATION TO INFORM PLAN

Strengths

According to the 2021-2022 Future Ready Index data the English Language Growth and Attainment measure, 10th and Green students scored 37% which exceeded the statewide average of 22.2%.

In 2021-2022, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, and English Language Learners subgroups all met or exceeded the statewide goal increase in perferformance from the previous year.

Kindergarten EOY exceeded the Reading Composite grade level goal. There was an increase of 68% of students who are at or above grade level from 20% BOY to 88.2% at EOY testing.

Grade 2 had a 16% increase of students who are at or above grade level from BOY to EOY in the retell acadience score.

Grade 3 increased their acadience retell from 17.8% at BOY to 42.6% at EOY. There was an increase of 24% of students who are at or above grade level in their retell.

There was a 12.2% increase in proficiency of English Language Learners on Science PSSA from 17.2% (2019-2020) to 29.4% 21-22.

Challenges

While 3rd Grade student data improved from 14.8% (2020-2021) to 19.4% (2021-2022), they did not meet the State Goal.

While 4th Grade student data improved from 11.8% (2020-2021) to 17% (2021-2022), they did not meet the State Goal.

There will be a Math goal for problem solving in all grades to be done monthly and displayed in a classroom and grade level Math wall display.

Not all teachers understand or buy in to an intervention block where students are homogeneously grouped for small periods of time to teach or re-teach their gap skills.

All teachers will have a dedicated Math Intervention block.

All teachers received training on the new iReady math program.

All teachers incorporated the fact fluency check into their monthly Math progress monitoring.

Foster a culture of high expectations for success for all students, educators, families, and community members.

Promote and sustain a positive school environment where all members feel welcomed, supported and safe in school: socially, emotionally, intellectually, and physically.

On the Naviance Career Readiness, Grades 3 and 4 each had a 96% completion rate for all required tasks, which is above the state expectation of 95% for the year

Implement evidence-based strategies to engage families to support learning

ELL students in grades 3-4 increased their ELA scores 5.3% from 6.0% last reporting (2019-2020) to 11.3% 2021-22.

All teachers incorporated small group instruction into the Math block.

Challenges

Align curriculum, assessments, and instruction to the PA Standards.

Not all teachers check for comprehension as often as possible.

Not all teachers track their small groups' work and adjust instruction routinely.

Grade 1 had a 6% decrease of students who are at or above grade level from BOY to EOY in their composite score.

Special Education teachers will be pulling small groups to ensure students with individualized plans fully meet their Math IEP goals.

For the 2021-2022 SY, 10th & Green did not have a full staff of certified teachers in the ESL or Sp. Ed. department to fully service students.

For the 2021-2022 SY, attendance was impacted by COVID protocols which affected consisted academic instruction.

There was a decrease of 3.8% of English Learners Proficiency on 2021 Math PSSA for Grades 3 & 4.
